TRAVEL IDEAS

There are so many itineraries you could travel in Australia, each offering a unique and different visit to the country. Here we sample two weeks travelling from Sydney to Melbourne:

Day 1: Flight to Sydney (overnight)

Days 2, 3 & 4: Arrival. Check in to a hotel for 3 nights. City tour and sightseeing. Opera House visit, Bondi & Manly beaches, harbour tour. Rehearsal & two concerts

Day 5 & 6: Blue Mountains. Skyway tour, glow worm caves, treks, gardens, galleries, arts & crafts. 2 nights hotel. Rehearsal and concert.

Day 7 - 9: Travel Canberra. Sightseeing. Pan for gold! 3 nights hotel. Rehearsal and concert.

Day 8: Travel to Wagga Wagga. 1 night hotel.

Day: 10 - 12: Travel to Melbourne. Visit the beach, wine valley tour. Rehearsal and concert. Hotel 3 nights.

Day 13: Travel day. Fly to UK

Day 14: Arrival in UK
